

## Notes for implementation of Finishing Faithfully Series

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### Background

Sun City Christian Church (SCCC) is located in Sun City Arizona, a Dell Webb age-restricted community for adults aged 55 and older. SCCC celebrated 50 years worshipping together in November 2024. The majority of members live in the area year around, but several “snowbird” members reside in the area during the winter months and return to their summer residents.

This series was presented by the wellness team, whose mission is to empower individuals to be self-advocates for their medical care and wellness, as well as that of their loved ones and to alleviate isolation and loneliness. Individuals are encouraged to seek ways to remain active, better understand the aging process, community resources, and the medical system through all of the church programming.

### Notes

- Our series was completed over 7 weeks of the Lenten Season. The series was an opportunity for members to review their current plans and resulted in many updates to individuals plans.
- Several sessions were presented by internal experts
- We were careful to fully vet all external speakers to ensure they were the best in their field and that they presented critical information vs. advertising their agency.
- We include a light lunch with each session, including the Finishing Faithfully sessions. Favorites include an assortment of soups; build a sandwich or salad with sliced meat and cheeses, Mexican, or hot dogs; or pizza. Veggie trays, fruit trays, chips, drinks, and dessert are standard additions.

- The last 2 weeks were spent with internal personnel when many forms were witnessed by each other
- During the Lenten season, sessions were aligned with weekly bible study and sermon topics
- Wellness committee and pastor were available at each session for discussion, etc. Individuals continue to use the information provided in these sessions to make changes in their choices.
- Sessions were advertised through local social media sites and attracted individuals from the community as well as church members
- Keep copies of wishes and service planning tool in a secure location as family may not have access to information when needed

## **FINISHING FAITHFULLY**

The Wellness Committee of Sun City Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) is offering a special series on Wednesdays during the 2025 Lenten Season (March 3 – April 16) entitled “Finishing Faithful”. Each of the seven sessions support living faithfully to finish faithfully. Participants will learn how to document their beliefs, values, and preferences, along with suggestions on how to start a conversation with their loved ones about their wishes. All are welcome, and attendees are welcome to attend one, several, or all the sessions:

- Week One March 5<sup>th</sup> - we will learn how to write our own story
- Week Two March 12<sup>th</sup> - we will discuss the information we all need to record and share in case of emergency (e.g. emergency when not at home, accident or hospitalization, death) and how to talk with physicians about your healthcare needs and desires at end-of-life
- Week Three - March 19<sup>th</sup> - Patti of Hospice of the Valley will share about Comfort care, including palliative and hospice care
- Week Four - March 26<sup>th</sup> - Ryan of SG Insurance and Estate Services will share information about financial and legal needs
- Week Five - April 2<sup>nd</sup> - Nancie of Menke Funeral Home and Crematory will explain funerals, cremation, and processes
- Week Six – April 9<sup>th</sup> we will discuss with our inhouse experts how to start the discussions with our family members and others
- Week Seven – April 16<sup>th</sup> - with our inhouse experts we will formulate our personal, family, and spiritual plans

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### **Week Two March 12<sup>th</sup>**

Dr. Marcia Blake, PhD will discuss keeping and organizing passwords and important documents. Dr. Blake will share the information we all need to record and share in case of emergency (e.g. emergency when not at home, accident or hospitalization, death) including organizing and recording passwords to ensure we don't forget or lose them, emergency information we need to carry and have available in our homes, and providing for pets.

Dr. Bill, M.D., will help us understand how to talk with physicians about on-going healthcare needs and desires at end-of-life. We will explore some specific questions to ask physicians in different settings as well as information to share for the most effective care possible.

### **Week Three - March 19<sup>th</sup>**

Patti, of Hospice of the Valley will share information about the services provided by Hospice of the Valley, ranging from supportive care, dementia care, volunteer companionship, grief support, programs to honor veterans and comfort care which includes palliative and hospice care that provides compassionate comfort care and dignity for individuals and their loved ones.

### **Week Four - March 26<sup>th</sup>**

Ryan, of SG Insurance and Estate Services, will share information about the importance of financial and legal planning is the foundation of ensuring your plan is accomplished. He will discuss needs including how to prepare for seeking services with a variety of specialists including estate attorneys, financial planners, wealth management specialists, and life insurance consultants, as well as sharing important information to consider when making plans.

### **Week Five - April 2<sup>nd</sup>**

Nancie of Menke Funeral Home and Crematory will share information and explain funerals, cremation, and processes and what to expect at each stage of this difficult time of life. In addition, she will discuss pre-planning and pre-payment options, which allow one to select services and locks in the price of services.

### **Week Six – April 9<sup>th</sup>**

Rev. Brett, along with Fred, MC, and Judith, CANP, RN, (expert leader of five Wishes Advance Care program), will discuss how to prepare and start Advance Care discussions with our family members and loved ones.

### **Week Seven – April 16<sup>th</sup>**

Rev. Brett, along with Fred, MC, and Judith, CANP, RN, will discuss the formation of our personal, family, and spiritual plans, and discussing them with our family members and loved ones.
