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### **A WORSHIP REFLECTION**

This devotion is based on a writing by Pastor Chris Roberts titled “Justice, Mercy and Humility.” From Micah 6:8, *“He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God.”* Micah presents a “job description” for the Christian life. We are to be people who do justice, who love mercy, and who walk humbly before God. This is a message that is ever before the leaders of outreach ministries as we all seek to become “the voice for the voiceless” to whom we all minister (whether we serve children, homeless, the elderly, or serve in an outdoor church) we all reach out to those who don’t seem to “FIT” into our modern, capitalistic society. We do the work that few others find appealing—or sexy—it is the thankless work of serving those who are MOST OFTEN forgotten.

There are many churches today who think that when Christians pray, read their Bibles, go to church and avoid immoral behavior, then they have done enough. Certainly, these things are good, but we all know that there is MUCH, MUCH more that we CAN and MUST do... if we are, indeed, to call ourselves “Disciples of Christ.” God has told us what is good: to do justice. We are to be men and women who seek to treat all people according to God’s own standard of justice. We are to be people who urge others to ALSO treat ‘ALL PEOPLE’ according to God’s own standards. God expects us to fight against oppression wherever it is found. God expects us to defend the defenseless, wherever they are found.

And, God expects us all to exercise love and mercy wherever it is possible to do so.

- Some of us take food to the hungry.
- Some of us provide clothing for those who are naked.
- Some of us go to the prisons to visit men and women there.
- Some provide support and aid where families struggle because of generational poverty.

- Some serve the elderly...
- Some of us serve those who are called “refugees.”

Our mission and our work may vary and, yet, we all serve the same God. We all are doing the work of the one who sent us. Because we love the Sender, we love the ones to whom we are Sent. **And so, the challenge for each of us is to “NOT grow weary in our well-doing. For in due season, we will reap if we faint not.”**

So, let us recommit ourselves to the work of the Lord...

To do justice

To love mercy

And, to walk ever so humbly with Our God.
